#### ▲閱讀下文,回答第31-35題

Since World War II, the manufacture of plastic has grown rapidly, leading to severe pollution. It has been noted that, by 2015, 60% of all plastic made had turned into waste, much of which ends up in oceans. Approximately 80% of oceanic plastic comes from land, while 20% originates from activities such as fishing and shipping. This waste can persist for centuries, affecting sea life and humans in a negative manner. Each year, 12 million tons of plastic enter oceans, creating what the United Nations calls "a planetary crisis", threatening ecosystems and human health worldwide.

To address the issue of plastic pollution, scientists are developing innovative solutions. For example, microbiologists at Hong Kong Polytechnic University are working on a method to eliminate microplastics from water using bacteria that create sticky biofilms. Microplastics, which are tiny plastic fragments smaller than 5mm, pose severe environmental risks. They accumulate in sea life and enter the food chain, ultimately impacting human health. These efforts highlight the growing focus on tackling the harmful effects of plastic waste on both ecosystems and people.

In 2021, a group of Japanese scientists discovered a bacterium called "Ideonella sakaiensis" capable of decomposing plastic. These bacteria, found in waste-filled trenches, use plastic's carbon for energy, "eating" it in an effective manner. Similarly, researchers in the US have developed a "self-digesting plastic" that could help reduce waste. Additionally, scientists at the Leibniz Institute in Berlin identified microfungi that can break down synthetic plastics. These breakthroughs provide promising biological tools to combat plastic pollution and minimize its harmful impact on the environment.

Although plastic pollution is a major challenge globally, recent innovations have offered hope for a cleaner future. Biological solutions such as bacteria and fungi and new materials have shown significant promise to this end. However, further research and collaboration remain essential to ensure a lasting impact. By advancing these solutions or creating innovative solutions to reducing plastic pollution, it is hoped that the harmful effects of plastic waste could be eventually eliminated, striving for a more sustainable environment for future generations.
