In the sharing economy, anyone can be a business person. People can make money with ridesharing, by renting out their cars, or even by renting out their homes. While allowing people to stay in your home might be a nice way to make some extra money, vacation rentals have negative effects on communities.

One negative effect of vacation rentals is that they can harm neighborhoods. For example, they can change the character of neighborhoods, particularly those in popular destinations. Small numbers of tourists on weekdays or in the **off-peak** season can mean nearly empty neighborhoods, making the areas easy targets for burglars. Vacation rentals can also cause neighborhood businesses to lose money. If vacation rentals are empty for days at a time, small grocers and other

neighborhood businesses will not have a lot of customers.

Vacation rentals also have negative effects on housing in a community. First of all, short-term vacation rentals can cause housing shortages, as landlords rent apartments out to tourists rather than make them available to local residents. In addition, vacation rentals drive up housing prices in a community. If there are fewer apartments available, rents tend to go up, forcing people with average incomes to move outside of the community.

Short-term vacation rentals have harmful effects on communities. They can negatively impact the character and economy of a neighborhood, and lead to housing shortages and higher rents. When tourism takes over a neighborhood and drives local residents away, is it even the same place anymore?

First impressions are crucial because they can make or break an opportunity. It's human nature to make a snap judgment about someone when we first meet people. Business deals can be made or broken, first dates become second dates or not, and friendships are built or fail to form; everything depends on that initial encounter. Despite the importance first impressions seem to have in our lives, researchers have argued that they actually don't tell the whole story.

People form first impressions of others every day. For instance, while waiting in line at our favorite bubble tea shop, we see the person in front complaining about the wait, and commenting on the service from the employees. This rude customer in front of us in line does not create a good first impression. An example of his poor behavior and his rudeness leads us to assume he must have the other negative traits. We tend to see a small sample of others' behavior as indicating their true personality. When we see someone else is acting in a negative way, we think it is because he or she is a negative person. In contrast, we don't think that way about our own behavior.

If we are rude to the employees taking our orders in the bubble tea shops, we will find reasons for our bad behavior—the service is too slow, the schoolwork is stressful or workloads are heavy. That is, when we act in a negative way, we say it is because of the situation. But if another customer is rude, we think it must be his or her personality. Though first impressions allow us to make sense of new information, and form relationships with new people, we might still make some errors while making first impressions of others. Evidently, it is essential for us to take a second look.
