Ayurvedic medicine is a system of healing from ancient India. It is thought to be the oldest system of medicine, perhaps 5,000 years old. Now, it is still widely practiced in many countries like India, Nepal, and Sri Lanka. Ayu means “life” and veda means “knowledge” or “wisdom.” 16, ayurvedic means “the knowledge of life.” It takes a holistic approach to health, seeking to maintain a harmonious balance between our body, mind, and soul. In this way, it aims to 17 disease and illness.

According to the Ayurvedic system, there is a central life force called “prana.” Prana includes five basic elements: space, air, fire, water, and earth. These elements 18 into three categories called “doshas”, which are Vata (air and space), Pitta (fire and water), and Kapha (water and earth). Every person has a unique combination of these three doshas, 19 influences him or her physically and emotionally, and affects how they interact with the world around them.

Ayurvedic medicine aims to keep each individual’s body in a healthy balance according to its unique combination of doshas. Ayurveda is not a single technique or activity. It is a 20, which needs to be followed every day through the use of diet, meditation, yoga, and other methods. It is believed that people who follow the principles of Ayurveda will enjoy excellent physical and mental health.

The news on a TV station is not just reporting the up-to-date events that matter to people's lives. It is also a money-making business where the money is in the ratings the TV station gets. These ratings show how many people are watching the news the station is broadcasting. Based on the number of the viewers, these ratings allow the station to set prices for its advertisements. The more viewers the station has, the greater the profit.

In order to get more people watching the news they reported, news reporters try everything they can to search for **eye-catching news**. So today, it is quite common to see a TV reporter asking heartless questions of the family members of a victim in a crime scene, such as, "Do you feel sad to see your brother dead?" Asking such a heartless question while pointing a microphone toward the victim's family member, the reporter is hoping to capture the family member's emotional breakdown. That is exactly the kind of news that sells.

Several reasons can explain these reporters' lack of empathy in asking a heartless question. One is the inadequacy in journalistic practice. Before becoming a field reporter, one must receive professional training in college and the internship in the press. But, with more TV stations and news channels set up, more reporters are needed; thus, the hiring process for qualified reporters becomes loose. In addition, journalism has somehow become a show business, so new reporters are hired mostly because of their appearance, not their professionalism.

Another reason for the reporters' lack of empathy is that news ratings have become more important than ever. The mere report of facts may not bring about higher ratings, so news reporters would try different ways to disturb and even annoy the person they interview in order to get his or her emotional responses. The crying and out-of-control episodes on TV can definitely capture viewers' attention. Once the rating is up, profit comes along. The rise of ratings apparently arouses the reporters' bloodthirsty instinct for more controversial and violent news.

Being a journalist is not easy. It requires not only the capability to deal with time pressure, but also the intelligence to utilize proper questions to reveal facts for the viewers. However, with the overemphasis on ratings, the news programs are turning themselves into reality shows. When the power to supervise the government doesn't lead to the life of greater good, news stations devalue themselves into entertainment channels with bad tastes.
